#### Threats To Pets That Roam Outdoors


Domesticated pets may have evolved from wild animals, but it has been some time since dogs were needed to hunt like wolves or domesticated cats had to survive like wild leopards or tigers. While pets can enjoy time outdoors, it's important to avoid leaving them to their own devices for too long. The online health resource Healthcare for Pets says responsible pet ownership necessitates certain precautions to keep

pets safe when they venture out of the home.

The following is a list of potential dangers that can affect pets outdoors.

• Pesticides and poisons: Pet owners may use pet-friendly products in and around their homes. However, there's no guarantee that your neighbors do the same. Common lawn and garden products, including insecticides and pesticides, may cause anything from mild irritations to toxic poisoning.

• Weather: A fur coat does not offer complete protection from conditions like extreme weather. Pets can experience hypothermia or heat stroke if they are exposed to extreme weather for prolonged periods of time.

• Automobiles: Dogs and cats that wander can be struck by vehicles and/ or ingest potentially harmful substances leaking from cars or trucks. Automotive coolant (antifreeze) is often sweet and brightly colored, which attracts curious pets. Ethylene glycol in coolant is fatal to dogs and cats if ingested. Outdoor cats may hide or seek warmth in car engines, putting them at risk for injury.

• Exposure to illnesses: Young animals should not spend prolonged periods of time outdoors before they are vaccinated. However, the American Veterinary Society of Animal Behavior recommends that pet parents begin taking puppies on walks and public outings as early as one week after their initial rounds of vaccinations (roughly seven weeks old) because this is the window of time when socialization skills are learned. • Parasites: Bugs and parasites may be lurking outdoors. Parasitic worm

larvae, fleas, mosquitoes, and ticks can be harmful to pets. Ask your vet about year-round flea/tick/heartworm preventatives if a pet spends time outdoors.

• Other animals: Wild animals pose a risk to domesticated pets. They can pass illnesses on to pets or engage them in scuffles that result in injuries or even death. If companion animals are not spayed or neutered, pet owners may have to confront unexpected pregnancies after pets spend time outdoors.

Pets that spend time outdoors should be supervised whenever they leave the confines of their homes.



#### **US Postal Service: Changed Service** Standards

In a service alert released from the United States Postal Services (USPS) on Sept. 30, a new implementation of service standard change was outlined. According to the alert, starting Oct. 1, a new service standard for first-class mail and periodicals will "increase delivery reliability, consistency, and efficiency for customers and across the network."

This new standard will only affect 39% of firstclass mail, and 7% of periodicals, the service alert said. The majority will not be impacted. The alert said "Standards for single-piece First-Class Mail traveling within a local area will continue to be two days." "A local area," as outlined in the alert, regards "First-Class Mail that travels within a three-hour drive between originating and destinating processing facilities."

USPS states that the postal service "has not consistently met its published service standards over the last eight years," as the service has needed to rely on air transportation, which is "less reliable and more costly than surface

transportation." Changing these standards will help USPS allow their deliveries to rely further on ground transportation, subsequently keeping postage rates affordable and allowing their delivery standards to be met more efficiently.

The new service standards will mostly affect mail traveling greater distances. In the report, the standards are outlined as follows: Mail traveling 140-930 miles (3-20 hours) is now a 3-day standard. Mail traveling 931-1,907 miles (20-41 hours) is now a 4-day standard. Mail traveling 1,908+ (Over 41 hours) is now a 5-day mailing standard. These standard updates are just pieces of the changes being implemented under the "USPS Delivering for America" 10-year plan. USPS suggests consumers plan ahead and send out mail or parcels that require a deadline early to ensure the delivery date fits within these new standards.

USPS specifies and says, "If it would take you more than a day to drive your mail to its destination, make sure to give your long-distance mail some extra time to travel."

#### Hygienic **Alternatives** To **Apple Bobbing**

People who were born in the early 1980s and earlier likely spent some time bobbing for apples each fall. Bobbing for apples long has been a classic autumn activity. Yet today's children may not know what it entails.

Bobbing for apples is a tradition that began in Europe hundreds of years ago as a courting ritual or a way to see who would get married next. When Europeans settled in the United States and Canada, they brought their apple bobbing traditions with them. However, over the years, bobbing evolved from an activity geared around romance to one focused on fun for children.

Apple bobbing has largely fallen out of favor as more parents zeroed in on the potential yuck factor of having several mouths and noses dunked into the same bucket of water trying to grab a Red Delicious or Granny Smith. The pandemic also undoubtedly made some people skeptical about the safety of apple bobbing. Thankfully, there are alternatives for those who want to enjoy the spirit of apple bobbing without spreading germs.

#### Hanging apples

Tie strings to the stems of apples and hang each indi-

vidual apple to a clothesline. Without using their hands, participants must consume the majority of the apple of their choosing. Whoever finishes first wins a prize.

#### **Bobbing individually**

One workaround to create more hygienic fun is to give party participants their own separate bowls or buckets for bobbing. Plastic beverage tubs at dollar stores are inexpensive and readily available. Fill them up with water and float two or three apples in each. Then the race is on for each participant to snag some apples.

#### **Grabbing for apples**

Kids need not use their jaws to grab apples. Kids can use small spoons, chopsticks, a spatula anything you can think of - to make it challenging to grab a floating apple.

#### Symbolic 'apple' toss

Fill up red water balloons with water and set up a traditional water balloon toss. Participants pair up and toss the "apples" to one another, moving further and further away with each round. The last pair to have an intact "apple" wins.

#### How Physical Activity Can Help In The Fight Against Breast Cancer

Breast cancer is a complex disease that affects millions of women across the globe each year. Though the American Cancer Society reports that only about 4 percent of women diagnosed with breast cancer in the United States are under age 40, women of all ages can take steps to protect themselves against this deadly disease.

Exercise benefits women in myriad ways, and that includes lowering their risk for breast cancer. The ACS notes that researchers are increasingly linking exercise to a reduced risk for breast cancer. Though the reasons behind that link remain unclear, some theorize that the positive effects of exercise on body weight, inflammation, hormones, and energy balance could be why regular physical activity helps women reduce their risk for breast cancer.

## Body weight and breast cancer

The National Cancer Institute reports that being obese after menopause can significantly increase a woman's risk for breast cancer. In addition, the ACS attributes the rise in hormone receptor-positive breast cancers to an increased prevalence of excessive body weight. Routine exercise is a highly effective way to lose weight and keep weight off, which in turn could lower women's risk for breast cancer.

Being sedentary and breast cancer

Exercise is a not a sedentary activity, and that could be another reason why women who are physically active have a lower risk for breast cancer. The ACS notes that more than one study has linked sitting time to a higher risk of various diseases, including breast cancer. Researchers with the ACS analyzed data from 77,462 women, who they followed for an average of 15.8 years. None of the participants had cancer when the study started, but researchers found that women who sat for six or more hours per day



#### Does physical activity really reduce breast cancer risk?

The human body is complex, and a host of factors, including those like age that women have no control over, can affect cancer risk. However, engaging in routine physical activity seems to be an effective way for women to reduce their risk for breast cancer. In fact, the Breast Cancer Research Foundation estimates that one-third of all breast cancer cases could be prevented with positive lifestyle choices that help women maintain a healthy weight, including exercise.

Routine physical activity can be a significant weapon in women's arsenal as they continue their efforts to prevent and overcome breast cancer.

Women diagnosed with breast cancer who want to speak with someone who has survived the disease can do so thanks to a unique program sponsored by the American Cancer Society. The Reach to Recovery program from the ACS connects current cancer patients with breast cancer survivors via an online chat. Patients, regardless of where they are in their cancer journeys, can connect with volunteers for one-on-one support. Volunteers can help patients cope with treatment and side effects while also offering advice on speaking with friends and family, working while receiving treatment and more. Even people facing a possible breast cancer diagnosis can sign up. The program works by asking patients and volunteers to join the program and create profiles on the Reach to Recovery website (www.reach.cancer.org). Patients then look for a match by searching volunteer profiles, filtering through suggested matches and sending an online chat request to volunteers. Patients and volunteers can then schedule a chat and discuss any concerns patients may have. Volunteers with the Reach to Recovery program are breast cancer survivors who have been trained by the ACS to provide peer-to-peer support to people facing a breast cancer diagnosis. Volunteers can provide support to patients, but are prohibited from offering medical advice. Roasting pumpkin seeds is a straightforward process, though some people may have their own techniques to make seeds more flavorful. The following recipe for "Pumpkin Seeds" from the Food Network reflects various ways to prepare this beloved snack, ensuring that people with varying tastes can no doubt find a way to incorporate their favorite flavors into this Halloween staple.

#### **Pumpkin Seeds**

- 1. Seed the pumpkin: Preheat the oven to 300 degrees F. Using a spoon, scrape the pulp and seeds out of your pumpkin into a bowl.
- 2. Clean the seeds: Separate the seeds from the stringy pulp, rinse the seeds in a colander under cold water, then shake dry. Don't blot with paper towels; the seeds will stick.
- 3. Dry them: Spread the seeds in a single layer on an oiled baking sheet and roast 30 minutes to dry them out.
- 4. Add spices: Toss the seeds with olive oil, salt and your choice of spices (see below). Return to the oven and bake until crisp and golden, about 20 more minutes.
  - *A. Sweet* Toss with cinnamon and sugar (do not use salt in step 4).
- *B. Indian* Toss with garam masala; mix with currants after roasting.
- *C. Spanish* Toss with smoked paprika; mix with slivered almonds after roasting.
- *D. Italian* Toss with grated parmesan and dried oregano.
- *E. Barbecue* Toss with brown sugar, chipotle chile powder and ground cumin.


