

The Hunting Tavern Museum, home to the Andes Society for History and Cultural (ASHC), reopened in 2022 with a fresh new look. ASHC's all-volunteer board worked industriously, sprucing up rooms housing the hamlet's historical collections and raising funds for improvements. The museum has a new roof and its wheelchair ramp has been completed.

"Our town has a great story to tell," observes Joanne Warner, ASCH Board president. The Hunting Tavern Museum is where that story unfolds. For over 200 years, it has played a key role in the life of the Andes community," she adds. It has worn many hats - as a tavern, a hotel, a stagecoach stop, a home, a hardware store, an apartment house and now, a museum. It was time to add a new chapter to the story."

The Hunting Tavern, as we know it today – a spacious two-level gray clapboard structure built in the 1820s - had nothing to do with hunting – a popular misconception. The tavern was named after the Hunting family who purchased it in 1838, operating it as both a tavern and hotel. The Delaware-Esopus Turnpike, now Andes' Main Street, provided the tavern with steady business. The stagecoach stopped three times a week, carrying weary travelers in need of respite and mail that villagers picked up at the tavern. More than a century and a half later, The Gladstone family – Walter, his wife Patricia and Edna Gladstone Benedict - gifted the tavern to the ASHC. A dedication ceremony, held in 1999, marked the official opening of the Hunting Tavern as a museum and as a venue for cultural events.

Over the July Fourth weekend in 2022, 50 visitors walked through rooms where affluent patrons dined and entertained guests over two centuries ago. They took in a display cabinet containing 17th century artifacts from the museum's earliest predecessor - a one-room log tavern structure, built on the same plot where the museum is today. Visitors climbed the stairs to the large second-floor room used for dances and sleeping quarters in the 1800s. The original



The farmers had to pay a yearly rent and give part of their harvest and produce to the landlord. If farmers couldn't meet rent payments, local law enforcement was called in to oversee the forced sale of their land. Discontent erupted among the farmers. Anti-Rent societies were formed to try to prevent officials from carrying out their duties. They adopted Indian costumes in the spirit of the 1776 Boston tea party rebels, and wore leather masks. Two original 1845 masks and a Calico Indian costume from the 1976 Anti-Rent reenactment are on display in the taproom. A tin horn, used to warn protesters that the sheriff was coming, is a recent museum acquisition.

swinging doors that dropped down from the ceiling at night to separate the room into male and female sleeping areas, are still there.

This room is also where Delaware County Undersheriff Osborn Steele hid from anti-rent protesters dressed as Calico Indians in the spring of 1845. A portrait of Steele that hung in the Delaware County Courthouse is on view in the museum's taproom. It was here that Steele had his last drink before riding off to oversee the sale of livestock at the Moses Earle farm, saying, "Lead cannot penetrate Steele." He was fatally shot and his body brought back to the tavern.

The taproom, now devoted to the Anti-Rent War, houses a framed contract signed in 1824 by Janet Montgomery, wife of General Robert Montgomery, who died in the Revolutionary War. Large tracts of land in the Catskills, such as the 20,000 acres that Mrs. Montgomery inherited from her father, were granted to wealthy land barons by King George of England. The barons rented the parcels to settlers who farmed them - often barely eking out a living.

"It is fascinating how all of the different pieces from different historical periods have come together to tell the Andes story," notes Warner, who served as curator of the Wallcoverings Collection at the Cooper Hewitt Smithsonian Design Museum in New York City before moving to Andes. New signage by Warner, with input from Andes resident and long term ASHC board member Jim Andrews, guides visitors through the museum, giving a better insight into the events that shaped the hamlet. Each room now has signs that tell a story as to how the room was used long ago. Indi-

It was there that she first met ASHC board member Linda Dunne, who served as deputy director before relocating to Andes as well. Working collaboratively with other volunteers, Warner and Dunne began to update the Hunting Tavern Museum's content reappointing furnishings and refreshing gallery spaces.

Rooms were organized with exhibits pertaining to each period in Andes history - from its earliest tavern days to the building of the Pepacton Reservoir in the 1950s. The reservoir would bring muchneeded water to the growing population of New York City at great expense to the villages that were demolished and its residents relocated. Vintage photographs of these "lost villages," are now located upstairs in the museum, as are dairy and tool exhibits that speak to Andes' farming past.

In 1953, the post office interior was removed intact from the corner building it occupied and donated by the U.S. Postal Service to ASHC. It, too, can be visited in its permanent home on the second floor. PRIVATE

vidual labels next to exhibits make the viewing of paintings, maps, exhibits, furnishings and décor more meaningful.

Magnifying glasses have been installed next to vintage maps to help visitors view and study them more closely. "People are enjoying the new signs," observed volunteer Sarah Lewis, who contributed one of the earliest maps of Andes (circa 1856) on display in the entrance hallway. "They stay longer than before, reading the signs and taking in their historical content."

One of the first rooms to enjoy a makeover was the front parlor. Shards of glass from tumblers and pieces of flow blue chinaware dating to the 1800s were among the artifacts uncovered in the 1999 archaeological survey undertaken by students of SUNY Binghamton.

"Dug up from underneath this room, they support the fact that the parlor was used for dining during this period," says Dunne. One can picture Duncan Ballantine and Henry Dowie, leading Andes citizens in the 1800s, enjoying a meal with their families and friends, served on this fine china. The Italianate mansion that Ballantine built still sits off Main Street."

A trip made by volunteers to the Pleasant Valley Meeting House, also owned by the Andes Society for History & Culture, yielded an 1800s rug below the present carpet. It fit in



home to WillBees. William Elwood, born and raised in Shavertown, donated a 1963 aerial photo revealing the remains of this village, lying underneath the Pepacton Reservoir. A wool "Tumbling Blocks" quilt from the 19th century, and a cotton summer coverlet from the same period are among recent acquisitions. The Museum is open Saturdays from 11 a.m.-4.p.m. through the October Columbus Day weekend.

A local resident visiting with out-of-town guests summed up the new look this way: "It's like visiting a whole new museum. It's very impressive."

perfectly with the rooms' 19th century furnishings and décor. Upon further research, the rug turned out to be an example of the first machine-made reversible rugs from that period. Volunteers took up paint brushes to give the parlor a fresh coat of yellow paint that bathes the room in a warm glow.

Additional acquisitions from donors are located in the museum's main room and are part of its expanded collections on view. They include a gift of a charming, hand-tinted lithographic print called Home & Family (circa 1845), donated by Andes residents Vera and Donald Liddle.

A focal point in the main room is another new acquisition - an Empire style chest of drawers, made locally by Howe & Jarvis cabinetmakers of Delhi (1834-1838), and restored by ASHC.





# TRANS AND HIVING THE PATSKILLS FOR AN

# BIKING AND HIKING THE CATSKILLS FOR AN ADVENTURE-PACKED GETAWAY

With so many outdoor recreation opportunities available throughout the Catskills, here are a handful of cycling and hiking options to explore. GPS coordinates of access points are included.

#### **Delaware County**

**Cycling the Pepacton Reservoir (Eastern Section)** This 20-mile, moderate road cycling loop is a favorite because it's relatively flat by Catskill standards. You can begin at the historic schoolhouse west of Margaretville on Route 28/30 (42.1221, -74.6748) or at the Shavertown Parking Area (42.0895, -74.8185). Shavertown is one of the communities that was sacrificed to make way for the Pepacton Reservoir. The cycling route incor-

porates Board of Water Supply Roads 8,9 and 10 on the south side of the reservoir and Route 30 and Routes 28/30 on the north side.

Shavertown Trail Beginning just north of the Shavertown Park-Area (42.0895, ing -74.8185), this easymoderate trail was built by the Catskill Mountain Club in cooperation with NYC Department of Environmental Protection.

At just under three miles, it offers a pond loop and a reservoir overlook, and it's a favorite family hike.

**Cycling the Catskill Scenic Trail** Following the route of the former Ulster and Delaware Railroad, this gravel-surfaced trail runs 26 miles from Roxbury (42.3027, -74.5542) to Bloomville (42.3320, -74.8033). Passing through the villages of Stamford and Hobart, the trail has mileage signs at road crossings and offers several places to stop and enjoy the scenery or get food and drink. Hybrid or mountain bikes are recommended. Although most of the trail is relatively smooth, the 1.6-mile section between State Routes 30 and 23A near Grand Gorge is unfinished yet passable.

#### **Greene County**

Huntersfield Creek Falls Trail & Pratt Rock Located in the hamlet of Prattsville, the Huntersfield Creek Falls Trail (42.3119, -74.4278) makes for an ideal accompaniment to Pratt Rock (42.3096, -74.4222), located on the edge of the hamlet. Each hike is approximately 1.5 miles and is considered easy-to-moderate. The Huntersfield Trail crosses old farmland, connects with a series of cascades along the creek, and offers views of Bearpen Mountain (3600'). The Pratt Rock Trail climbs to the famous stone carvings commissioned by Zadock Pratt, a site some have dubbed "Mount Rushmore of the East." Though unmarked, obvious trails continue to the top of the rocks and eventually arrive at a spectacular viewpoint overlooking the upper Schoharie Valley.

Hunter Rail Trail This is a multi-staged project that will connect Kaaterskill Falls with Dolan's Lake in the village of Hunter. As of Earth Day 2023 a new bridge over the Schoharie Creek will extend the western section. There are three short, separate sections of trail, making for easy walks or bike rides. The western section from Dolan's Lake (42.2069, -74.2075) to Clove Road is 1.4 miles; the Huckleberry Multi-Use Trail, centered on Rip Van Winkle Lake Park (42.1914, -74.1337) is 2 miles; and the Kaaterskill Rail Trail (foot travel only) is 1.7 miles, beginning at the Mountain Top Historical Society (42.1959, -74.0919) and ending at the parking area for Kaaterskill Falls. From this parking area, hikers can access the viewing platform atop the falls or continue into the greater trail system around Kaaterskill Clove and North-South Lake.

**Becker Hollow** For a more aggressive outing, seasoned hikers can enjoy the climb to the Hunter Mountain Fire Tower from the Becker Hollow Trailhead (42.1818, -74.1968). With over 2000' of elevation gain this 10.8-mile round-trip hike is one of the routes that brings you to the Catskills' second highest mountain.

#### Sullivan County

**Red Hill Fire Tower** Although this hike is actually in Ulster County, it is often accessed from nearby Sullivan County. There are two trailheads: one along the Denning Road, east of Claryville (41.9350,- 74.5291) and one at the end of the Old Dinch Road (41.9301, -74.5070) – both moderate hikes. The Dinch Road Trailhead is limited in winter, and the out-and-back distance to the fire tower from this trailhead is 3.6 miles. The Denning Road Trailhead is new, and the hike to the tower and back is four miles. Red Hill is one of six fire towers required to complete the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation's 2023 Fire Tower Challenge (www.dec.ny.gov/lands/76620.html).

**Willowemoc Wild Forest** This Wild Forest surrounds the Mongaup Pond State Campground and consists of 14,000+ acres, 40 miles of trails, and access to six ponds. A series of loop trails west of the campground is accessed from the parking area on Mongaup Road (41.9469, -74.7051). This trail system provides for a varied mix of hike lengths and visits to Frick Pond, Hodge Pond and Quick Lake. The convenience of the campground with 155 campsites also enhances extended-stay options and longer hikes. According to DEC, Mongaup Pond, at 120 acres, is the largest body of water in the Catskill Park, outside of the New York City reservoirs.

#### **Ulster County**

**Ashokan Rail Trail**. Eleven miles in length and almost level in gradient, this finely surfaced trail is very popular for walking, running and cycling. Traversing the wooded edge of the Ashokan Reservoir, it offers some expansive views of water and mountains. The trail can be accessed from points in West Hurley (41.9942, -74.0931), Ashokan (41.9750, -74.1975) and Boiceville (42.0023, -74.2706), with bike rentals available at the Ashokan location. The trail, like the Catskill Scenic Trail in Delaware County, follows a portion of the former Ulster & Delaware Railroad. However, the original route was relocated when the reservoir was constructed.

**Tanbark Trail** Located in the hamlet of Phoenicia (in the Phoenicia Park) (42.0851, -74.3117), this moderate-difficult, 2.2-mile loop trail climbs sharply from the outset. There are numerous rock formations along the way to two vista points. Parking is found elsewhere in the hamlet, which offers restaurants, shops, fishing, and camping.

**Rochester Hollow** West of Big Indian on Route 28, this trailhead is marked by brown-andwhite wayfinding signs, which lead you up Matyas Road to the small parking area (soon to be expanded). Much of the appeal of this easy-moderate hike is due to its gentle gradient along an old road with a nearby stream. Historical features include remnants of the estate of Colonel William Rochester (who served in the War of 1812) and a monument to the naturalist and author John Burroughs. Round trip mileages are 4.2 to the Burroughs monument and 5.6 to the lean-to. Two spur trails total 2 miles.

**Catskills Visitors Center** For comprehensive information on the region, the Catskills Visitor Center near Mount Tremper (42.0279, -74.2699) is open 9:30 – 4, April – November. The site offers short walks and includes the Esopus Fire Tower – one of the six towers in the Catskills Fire Tower Challenge.

Callicoon was known for timber rafting in the 1760s, where delimbed trees were floated downstream to sawmills before the Erie Railroad connected the Great Lakes with the eastern seaboard. A widespread fire wiped out almost every structure on Main Street in 1888 and residents rebuilt the business district, which is bisected by train tracks and retains its 1800s vibe.

Today, Callicoon is known for its scenic beauty and charming small-town atmosphere. It's located in western Sullivan County, and is surrounded by forests, mountains and rolling hills.

Callicoon offers plenty of outdoor activities like hiking, fishing, canoeing, and kayaking. The nearby Catskill Mountains and the Delaware River are popular destinations for outdoor enthusiasts.

#### Farming Community

Callicoon has a strong farming community, with several farms offering fresh produce, eggs and other farm products. The **Callicoon** Farmers' Market is held every Sunday from May to November and is a great place to find locally grown food. 





# **Jooked** on tradition:

# *celebrating the sport and art of fly fishing*

Livingston Manor and Roscoe, located in the Catskills in Sullivan County, are well-known destinations for fly fishing enthusiasts. The area's rich history of fly fishing dates back to the mid-19th century.

In the mid-1800s, fly fishing began to gain popularity in the United States, and anglers began to explore the streams and rivers of the Catskills. The region's abundant trout population and beautiful scenery made it an ideal destination for fishing enthusiasts.

One of the most famous figures in Catskills fly fishing history is Theodore Gordon. Gordon is credited with developing many of the fly fishing techniques that are still used today. He lived in Roscoe and fished the Beaver Kill extensively. In the late 1800s, Gordon began to develop his own flies and fly tying techniques, which were more effective than the traditional English patterns that were popular at the time.

Gordon is widely considered to be the father of American dry fly fishing, and he is credited with creating several famous fly patterns that are still in use. One of his most famous creations is the Quill Gordon. The Quill Gordon is a classic dry fly pattern that imitates

the early season mayfly hatch, and it is a favored choice among fly fishers today.

Another famed fly tyer and angler, Lee Wulff, created several patterns in the 1930s including the Royal Wulff, the White Wulff, the Grey Wulff, and the Adams Wulff, among others.

The flies are known for their bushy, highly visible wings, which make them easy for anglers to see on the water.

bodies are made from a variety of materials, including peacock herl, dubbing, or synthetic materials.

Wulff flies are highly effective at imitating a wide range of mayflies and other insects, and are popular choices for fly fishing for trout, grayling, and other freshwater species. The Wulff series of flies have become classic patterns

and are widely used by fly fishermen around the world.

Both anglers and fly tyers are memorialized for their contributions to the sport and the art of fly fishing as well as their conservation efforts at the Catskill Fly Fishing Center and Museum in Livingston Manor where exhibits are dedicated to them. They believed fly fishing

h as a history and heritage worth preserving. Many of the techniques and traditions of fly fishing have been passed down through generations, and preserving the heritage can help maintain a connection to the past.

Fly fishing is a significant economic driver and helps support local economies and businesses.

Today, the Beaver Kill and Willowemac in Livingston Manor and Roscoe, along with the east and west branches and the main stem of the Del-

aware River in Delaware County, and the Little Delaware River and Trout Creek in the town of Trout Creek, remain popular destinations for fly fishing enthusiasts.

There are five types of trout in New York waterways, including brook trout, also known as speckled trout, and are the only native species in the state. They prefer cold, clean water and are typically found in small streams and high elevation lakes.

Brown trout are an introduced species now found widely throughout the state. They are known for their aggressive behavior and can grow to be quite large.

Rainbow trout are also an introduced species and are popular among anglers due to their acrobatic fighting style. They are often stocked in streams and lakes and can be found in some wild populations.

Lake trout are typically found in larger, deeper lakes. They are known for their size and can grow to over 30 pounds.

> Steelhead trout are migratory rainbow trout and are found in Lake Ontario and its tributaries. They are known for their strong runs.



From July through September apiarists across the Catskills harvest, bottle and sell honey produced by their carefully raised bee colonies. Because the taste and color of honey depends on the type of foraged nectar, there is an abundance of nuanced flavors available in Catskillmade honey.

Bees play a vital role in our ecosystem and are responsible for pollinating plants and helping to maintain biodiversity. They also produce one of nature's most delicious and versatile products: honey.

The process of making honey begins when forager bees collect nectar and bring it back to the hive. Once there,

worker bees process the nectar by adding enzymes and then storing it in honeycomb cells.

Over time, the water content of the nectar is reduced through evaporation, and the sugar concentration increases. This process is aided by the fanning of the bees' wings, which helps to circulate air around the hive and remove excess moisture. The resulting product is honey, which is then sealed in honeycomb cells with wax.

Honey is a versatile ingredient that can be used in a wide range of recipes, from sweet treats like cakes and cookies to savory dishes like marinades and dressings. It is also a natural source of energy and has been used for medicinal purposes for thousands of years.




